We are pleased to invite you to participate in The Learning Program™ 2020-2021. Over the past 16 years, the Learning Program has evolved into a national model for intervention. Working with researchers, credentialed teachers, licensed therapists and professors, the program serves to model best practices for working with students with Down syndrome.

During non-Covid times, direct instruction to parents and students is provided with emphasis on literacy, math, language, fine motor, and social skills. To comply with State regulations, we are pivoting this year to provide new and improved **online** learning experiences directed towards parents and teachers.

- Registration and payment must be received by <u>September 15th, 2020</u> for a guaranteed spot.
- Each class will meet online once a month from September 2020 through June 2021 for 1.5 hours.
- Live class times will be scheduled at varied times to accommodate your schedules.
- There will be free resources to download from the LP Online Portal. Additionally, you will be able to purchase reading resources from DSF at a discounted rate.
- To enroll in LP Online and secure your spot, please complete the accompanying registration form and email, or mail it to us with the nonrefundable registration fee of \$50 and your tuition payment option by September 15th, 2020.
